WEST BENGAL JUDICIAL SERVICE EXAMINATION, 2014

INFORMATION TO CANDIDATES

The Public Service Commission, West Bengal will hold the **West Bengal Judicial Service Examination, 2014** in accordance with the existing rules for recruitment to the posts in West Bengal Judicial Service. The necessary particulars are stated in the following paragraphs. A candidate should verify from the notified rules that he/she is eligible for admission to the examination. The conditions prescribed cannot be relaxed.

The Examination will be held in three successive stages, viz., (i) Preliminary Examination (multiple choice objective type), (ii) Final Examination (Conventional Type – Written) and (iii) Personality Test.

The Preliminary Examination will be held in Kolkata and Darjeeling in <u>May, 2014</u> or thereabout. Only candidates of the three Hill Sub-divisions, viz., Darjeeling Sadar, Kalimpong and Kurseong will be allowed to appear at Darjeeling Centre. All candidates with low vision including those from the district of Darjeeling who require the help of scribe will be allowed to appear at Kolkata Centre only. The Final Examination will be held at Kolkata in <u>July, 2014</u> or thereabout.

<u>Scale of Pay</u> - Rs.27,700-770-33090-920-40450-1080-44770/-. Allowances will also be admissible as per Government orders in force.

<u>Vacancy</u> : Existing – 39 & Anticipated – 25 = 64 [Unreserved – 42, SC – 06, ST – 03, BC Category A – 06, BC Category B – 05, PWD – 02].

N.B. : All appointments will initially be made on a temporary basis.

<u>Qualification</u>: (i) A citizen of India or such a person of other nationality as declared eligible by Government of India; (ii) A degree in Law from any University or Institution affiliated to any University recognized by the State Government or the Central Government; (iii) Enrolment as an advocate in the roll of Bar Council of any State or Union Territory in India on the date of advertisement for the examination; (iv) Ability to read, write and speak in Bengali (not required in the case of Nepali speaking candidates of the three Hill Sub-divisions of Darjeeling District, viz., Darjeeling Sadar, Kalimpong and Kurseong).

<u>Age</u>: Not less than 23 years and not more than 35 years on the date of advertisement for the examination on <u>01.03.2014</u> (i.e. born not earlier than <u>02.03.1979</u> and not later than <u>01.03.1991</u>). Upper age limit is relaxable by 5 years for SC and ST candidates of West Bengal, by 3 years for BC candidates of West Bengal and upto 45 years of age for Persons with Disabilities having physical disability of 40% and above and by 2 years for candidates who have been in Government service for at least two years.

<u>CAUTION</u> : As per clause 49 of the Advocates Act, 1961 "an advocate shall not be a full time salaried employee of any person, Government, firm, corporation or concern, so long as he continues to practise and shall, on taking up any such employment, intimate the fact to the Bar Council on whose roll his name appears and shall thereupon cease to practise as an advocate so long as he continues in such employment".

NOTE : (I) The claim of a candidate for relaxation of age as a Government employee should be proved by a certificate from the appointing authority showing the period of his/her continuous service under Government and the same should be furnished along with the application; (ii) Age as recorded in Madhyamik or equivalent certificate will only be accepted; (iii) <u>Persons suffering from blindness or cerebral palsy have been exempted from the purview of reservation as contemplated under section 33 of Persons with Disabilities (Equal opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995 and (iv) Candidates with Low Vision will be allowed the help of a scribe, if required.</u>

<u>Chance Limit</u> : No candidate other than the candidates belonging to SC/ST/BC of West Bengal shall be allowed to appear in the examination for more than three times. The candidates belonging to SC/ST/BC of West Bengal shall not be allowed to appear in the examination for more than five times.

<u>Fee</u>: Candidates must enclose with their application a fee of **Rs.210/-** (Rupees Two Hundred Ten) only in the form of Indian Postal Order which must be purchased on a date after publication of this advertisement and crossed and endorsed to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, West Bengal or in the form of a receipted Challan from a Government Treasury in West Bengal or the Reserve Bank of India, Kolkata under the head "0051-00-105-State PSC-Examination fees-001-Examination fees-16-other fees". **Money Orders, Cheques, Bank Drafts, Cash etc. will not be accepted.** No application will be considered unless accompanied with the requisite application fees. Candidates belonging to SC/ST of West Bengal and Persons with Disabilities specified under Persons with Disabilities Rules, 1999 are not required to pay any fee. The applications without fee of such candidates will not be accepted if the same is not accompanied with the self-

attested photocopies of the SC/ST/PH certificates. Such exemption of fee is, however, not applicable to any BC candidate. No claim for refund of the fee will be entertained nor will it be held in reserve for any other examination.

<u>Application</u>: Application in the given proforma as available in the Commission's Website [http://www.pscwb.org.in] may be submitted personally in open condition at the enquiry counter of the Commission's office at 161-A, S.P. Mukherjee Road, Kolkata – 700 026 between 11-00 a.m. and 03-30 p.m. on all working days (Saturdays and Sundays are holidays) or sent by post (strictly by registered or speed post or U.C.P.) on or before the closing date addressed to the Deputy Secretary (Examination), Public Service Commission, West Bengal at the above address superscribing on the envelope the advertisement no. and name of the examination. <u>Applications received after the closing date shall be rejected</u>. The application form shall be filled in candidate's own handwriting with ball point pen in blue/black ink and signed by him/her. Should any of the statements made in the application be subsequently found to be false within the knowledge of the candidate, his/her candidature will be liable to cancellation, and even if appointed to a post on the results of this examination his/her service will be liable to be terminated. Willful suppression of any material fact will also be similarly dealt with. Candidates should take particular note that entries in their applications submitted to the Commission must be made correctly against all the items which will be treated as final and no alteration or addition in this regard will be entertained after submission of the application.

<u>Applications not duly filled in or found incomplete or without requisite documents or defective in any respect will be</u> <u>liable to rejection</u>. In case any of the columns of the Application Form is left unfilled the Application will be treated as <u>incomplete/defective and will be summarily rejected</u>.

Candidates in service of Government, a Local or Statutory Body must submit their applications in prescribed form with the requisite documents direct to the Commission's office within the closing date.

Candidates in service of Government, a Local or Statutory Body are required to submit an undertaking (as in the declaration printed in the Application Form) to the effect that they have informed, in writing, their Head of Office/Department as to their applying for the examination.

<u>N.B.</u>: Completed application must be submitted with (i) I.P.O./Treasury Challan, in original, for Rs.210/- only (not required for SC/ST candidates of West Bengal and for candidates having physical disabilities of 40% and above), (ii) One copy of his/her recent passport size photograph signed by him/her and pasted on the application; (iii) Self-attested photocopies of certificates of age and prescribed educational qualification; (iv) Self-attested photocopies of certificate obtained from the Bar Council in support of his/her enrollment as an Advocate in the roll of Bar Council of any State or Union Territory in India; (v) A certificate in original from the appointing authority for relaxation of age as Government servant (where necessary); (vi) Self-attested photocopies of documents issued by competent authority in favour of SC/ST/BC/PH (where necessary); (vii) Two unstamped self-addressed envelopes

Particulars and Certificates required :

(a) A candidate claiming to be S.C./S.T./B.C. must have a certificate in support of his / her claim from a competent authority of West Bengal as specified below [vide the West Bengal SCs and STs (Identification) Act, 1994 and SCs/STs Welfare Department Order No.261-TW/EC/MR-103/94 dated 06.04.1995 read with B.C.W. Deptt. Order No.6320-BCH/MR-84/10, dated 24.09.2010 and No.2420-BCW/MR-61/2012(Pt.) dated 12.07.2013] :

i) In the District, the Sub-Divisional Officer of the Sub-Division concerned, and

ii) In Kolkata, the District Magistrate, South 24-Parganas or such Additional District Magistrate, South 24-Parganas, as may be authorized by the District Magistrate, South 24-Parganas, in this behalf and the District Welfare Officer, Kolkata and Ex-officio Joint Director, Backward Class Welfare.

Persons with Disabilities (PWD) [40% and above] must have a certificate from a Medical Board constituted at Government Medical College Hospitals, District Hospitals and Sub-divisional Hospitals [vide West Bengal Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Rules, 1999].

(b) The Public Service Commission, W.B. may require such further proof or particulars from the candidates as it may consider necessary and may make enquiries about their character and other particulars regarding suitability and eligibility.

Original Certificates and photocopies of certificates duly self-attested relating to citizenship (by registration), age, qualifications, caste (SC/ST/BC), Physical disability (40% and above) and previous employment will have to be submitted when the Commission asks for them. If any candidate fails to furnish any certificate or any other relevant document or information relating to his / her candidature within the time specified by the Commission, his / her claim for allotment may be passed over without further reference to him / her.

No claim for being a member of the SC, ST and BC or a Person with Disability will be entertained after submission of the application.

N.B.: The Judicial Department, Government of West Bengal issued a Notification bearing No.386-J dated 24.01.2007 exempting the persons suffering from blindness and cerebral palsy from the purview of reservation in terms of proviso to

Sec. 33 of the Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995. The said Notification dated 24.01.2007 is reproduced below :

NOTIFIC ATION

No.386-J, dated the 24th January, 2007 – **WHEREAS** a person holding the posts of Civil Judge(junior division)/Judicial Magistrate (hereinafter referred to as the said post) under the West Bengal Judicial Service under the Judicial Department, Government of West Bengal, is required to examine several documents and is also required to take into consideration the fact of the cases before making proper adjudication of the litigations after hearing the parties;

AND WHEREAS judicial mind is required to be applied with by the judicial officers before any cases are disposed off by them;

AND WHEREAS any commission or omission on the part of the judicial officers on account of disability with blindness and cerebral palsy may hinder dispensation of justice to the litigant parties;

AND WHEREAS upon consideration of the facts stated above, it has been considered necessary that the said post, being non-promotional post, recruitment to which is made directly through Public Service Commission, shall not be required to be reserved for appointment from the persons suffering from blindness and cerebral palsy, as contemplated under the provisions of the Persons With Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995 (1 of 1996) (hereinafter referred to as the said Act);

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the power conferred by the proviso to section 33 of the said Act, the Governor is pleased hereby to exempt the persons suffering from blindness and cerebral palsy from the purview of reservation as contemplated under section 33 of the said Act.

Photograph :

The candidates must submit one copy of his / her recent passport size photograph which should be pasted on the first page in the space provided for the purpose in the application form. An identical copy of the photograph will be required for pasting on the Attendance Sheet to be sent by this office along with the Admit Card.

Caution :

(1) The candidates must abide by the instructions as may be given by Supervisors/Invigilators of the Examination. If the candidate fails to do so or indulge in disorderly or improperly conduct he/she will render himself/herself liable to expulsion from the Examination Hall and/or such other punishment as the Commission may deem fit to impose.

A candidate who has been reported against by the Supervisor of the Examination Centre for violating any of the instructions will be punished with cancellation of candidature and also debarment from future examinations and selections as may be decided by the Commission according to the circumstances of the case.

(2) <u>Submission of more than one application is strictly forbidden</u>. The candidature of a candidate who submits more than one application for admission to the Examination, will be cancelled even if he/she is admitted to the same.

A candidate should note that his/her admission to the Examination will be deemed provisional subject to determination of his/her eligibility in all respects. If at any stage even after issue of the letter of appointment a candidate is found ineligible for admission to this Examination, his/her candidature will be cancelled without further reference to him/her.

No candidate shall be allowed to take the Examination unless he/she holds the Admit Card for the examination.

<u>Canvassing</u>: Any attempt on the part of candidate to enlist support for his/her application through persons, officials of Government, or agencies will disqualify him/her for appointment. Specific recommendations from persons interested in the candidates, or otherwise known to them will be disregarded and will render the candidates ineligible.

Mobile Phone, Calculator or any other type of gadget of communication is strictly banned in the Examination Hall. Any infringement will attract penal action.
