- 4) Candidates, if selected, shall have to take admission immediately after the counseling on payment of necessary fees as given in the Information Bulletin. A candidate failing to take admission on the day shall forfeit the seat.

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1. The University

A feeder University in the North East India and a premier institution of Assam engaged in HRD, Research and Extension in Agriculture since 1969

Established on April 1, 1969 with its Headquarters at Jorhat, Assam Agricultural University (AAU) is the first institution of its kind in the whole North-Eastern Region of India. The base of this institution comprised the erstwhile Assam Agricultural College at Jorhat and the Assam Veterinary College at Khanapara, Guwahati. Subsequently, the College of Home Science at Jorhat, the College of Fisheries Science at Raha, the Biswanath College of Agriculture at Biswanath Chariali, the Dhubri College

of Agriculture at Chapar, the Lakhimpur College of Veterinary Science at North Lakhimpur, the College of Horticulture at Nalbari and the College of Sericulture at Titabar were established under the AAU.

The goal of the institution is to produce globally competitive human resources in farm sector and to carry out research in both conventional and frontier areas for production optimization as well as to disseminate the generated technologies as public good for benefiting the food growers/producers and traders involved in the

sector while emphasizing on sustainability, equity and overall food security at household level.

The mission of the University is to fill up talent gap in agriculture and allied sector to preposition the state to combat the emerging challenges in agriculture and ensure productivity increase in agri-horti-animal-fish crops on the face of shrinking/fragmented land holding, ailing soil health, diminishing water resources and increased human population.



2. Jurisdiction

The jurisdiction of the University extends to the entire state of Assam with regard to teaching, research and extension education in the field of agriculture and allied sciences.

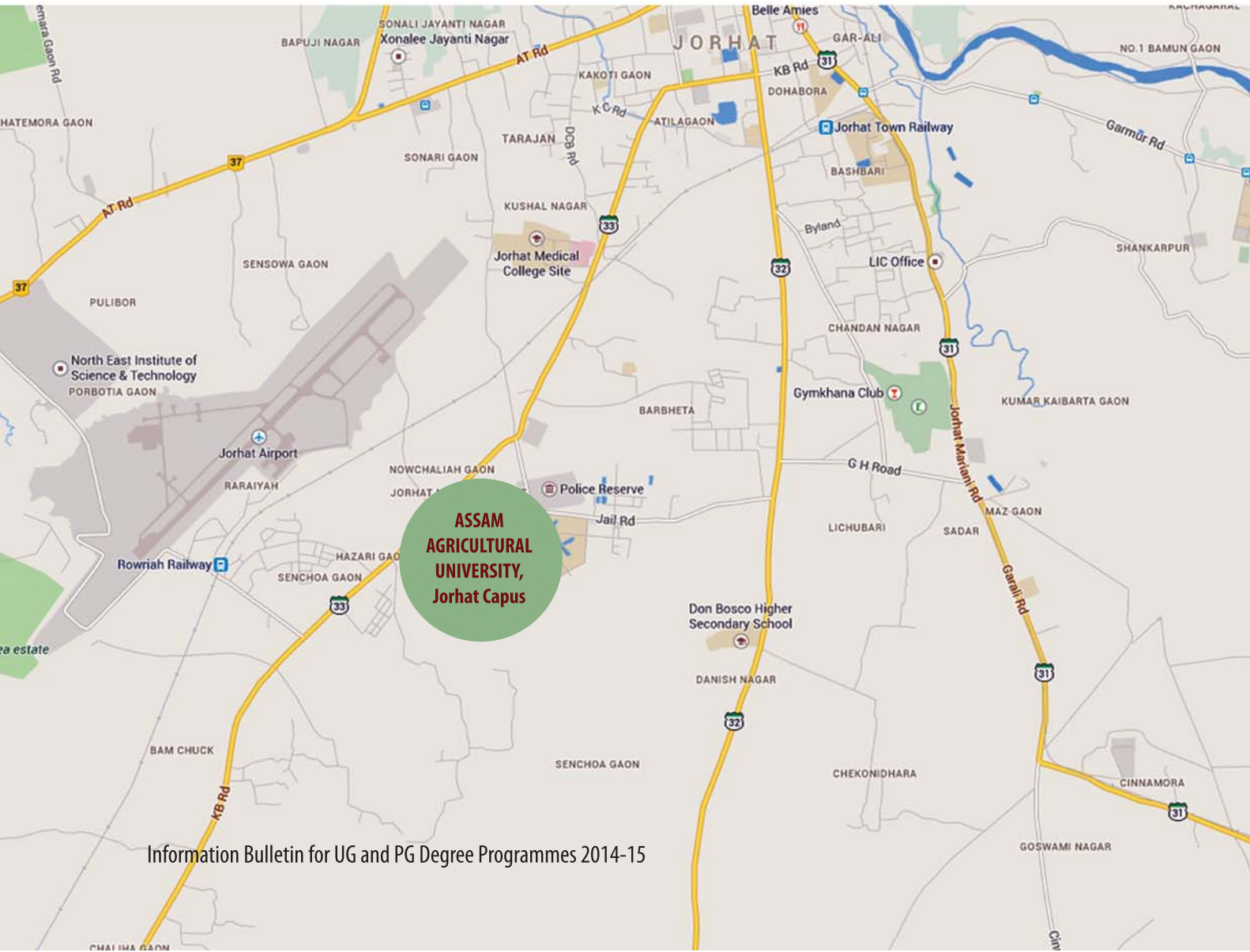
3. The University Campus

The University has a number of campuses with its Headquarters located at Borbheta at a distance of about 6 km from ISBT, Jorhat and 5 km from Jorhat railway station and 2 km from Jorhat airport. Jorhat can be reached easily from Guwahati, the capital of Assam, by bus/train/air. The latitude, longitude and altitude of Jorhat are 26°44'N, 94°10'E and 91 m above mean sea level, respectively.

AAU Headquarter is well connected by road with NH-37 together with railway link and a domestic airport.

4. Faculties

4.2. Faculty of Veterinary Science

The College of Veterinary Science, Guwahati had its origin in Assam Veterinary College established in 1948 at Nagaon. The College was shifted to the premises of the Directorate of Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Department, Government of Assam at Chenikuthi,

Guwahati in 1950. Later in 1960, the College was again shifted to its present location at Khanapara, Guwahati. This College was transferred to the AAU in 1969.

The Lakhimpur College of Veterinary Science at Azad started offering only B.V.Sc. & A.H. degree programme from 1988.

**30 seats are reserved for higher fee category (HFC) in B.Sc. (Agri) degree programme in the College of Agriculture, Jorhat. These seats are admissible to the Indian national from NE Region strictly on the basis of merit in the qualifying examination without any reservation against payment of higher fee (Refer Clause no 29) with a rider that not more than 5 (five) seats shall be allotted to any particular state to encourage admittance from the all the N.E. states including Sikkim. Similarly, 50 per cent of the vacant seats, if any, in the B.Sc. (H.Sc) and B.F.Sc degree programmes shall be made open to the candidates under higher fee category strictly on the basis of merit. Also, any additional vacancy that may arise be filled up from this category at the discretion of the Selection Committee. Those students admitted under higher fee category in all the degree programmes shall not be eligible for any financial benefits including Scholarship, Stipend, Internship and any other grants from the University.

5. Admission

5.1. How to apply

Candidates must apply online by registering and logging on to the university's website www.aau.ac.in. The site has been designed in a user-friendly way to help candidates to apply Online in a step by step basis.

1) **Download** the **Information Bulletin** and read it carefully before filling up the Online Application form.

2) Students must register themselves before filling up the Application form for any Degree Course under the University.

3) There are *3 steps* in filling the Application Form.

- Register yourself
- Pay the required Application Fee using the downloaded *Challan* at a nearby SBI branch
- Fill in the Application Form online

4) Applicants who registered for Veterinary Entrance Test (VET 2014) and paid the fees through *challan* can **go to the 3rd step** directly and Fill in the Application Form.

5) Applicants who registered for Veterinary Entrance Test (VET 2014) but did not pay the required fee must Register again for filling up the form.

University's Registration portal for online submission of application form for various undergraduate and post-graduate degree programmes

Step 1 - Registration

1) Read the Information Bulletin carefully before registration. The information given in the Registration Form **cannot** be changed afterwards. It cannot be corrected /modified by the Office.

2) Upload scanned photograph and signature (Dimension of photograph should be 3cm X 4cm with size maximum 35 kb and minimum 20kb. The Dimension of signature should be 3cm X 1cm with size maximum 30kb and minimum 15kb. The photograph and signature should be either in '.jpeg' or '.jpg' format).

3) The Registration will be completed only after the uploading of the Photograph and Signature.

4) Upon successful registration, the Applicant should be able to see his/her photograph and signature. Applicants should **note down the Registration No., Username and Password. He/She will require all these three credentials for future Login.**

5) Applicant shall receive a confirmation message with the credentials in the **Registered Mobile Number.**

6) Please note that if candidates commit any mistake in filling the online Registration, it cannot be corrected by this office. The **Office will take no responsibility** of any kind for such forms. The candidate can **Register afresh.**

Step 2 - Payment of Fee

- 1) Login with the Registration ID, Username and Password and Download/Print the Challan.
- 2) Pay ₹500.00 at any branch of State Bank of India through the printed challan. Please ensure with the Bank employee that the remittance is made in the name of the Applicant. **This is not required for those who have already paid for VET 2014.**
- 3) Update the **Journal No.** given on the Challan logging in with login credentials within 2 days of Payment to the Bank.
- 4) Applicant should receive a message of the receipt of payment.

Step 3 - Fill in the Application Form

- 1) If the fee is verified to be received by the Bank, the applicants will be able to fill in the application form by logging in with their Login Credentials.
- 2) The applicants appearing the VET 2014 will login to fill in the Application Form.
- 3) Applicants can fill or edit entered data in the form for any number of times and **save** the data.

PLEASE NOTE: Do not **Finalize** the Application Form till all the information are correctly entered. The **Application Form cannot be edited** after Finalization.

- 4) **Finalize** the Application Form if all Information are correctly entered.
- 5) **Application can be submitted online from June 2, 2014 to June 30, 2014.**
- 6) The system will also generate a label bearing the **correspondence address** and a **BARCODE**. The candidates are required to take a print out of the label and paste it on an A4 sized envelope, and send the confirmation sheet along with required documents by **Registered/ Speed Post** to the **Registrar, Assam Agricultural University, Jorhat 785 013.**
- 7) The online application requires **JavaScript to be enabled** in your browser to function properly. 5.2. Eligibility for Admission

The following are the minimum admission requirement for various degree programmes of the University.

5.2.1. Eligibility for Undergraduate Degree Programmes**5.2.1.1. Age**

A candidate for undergraduate degree programme shall be at least 17 years of age as on 01-08-2014 (*i.e.*, must have been born before 01-08-1997).

5.2.1.2. B.Sc.(Agri), B. Sc.(Hort), B.Sc.(Seri) and B.F.Sc. Degree Programme

- i) A candidate must have passed 10+2 examination with Biology, Chemistry and Physics (BCP) or Agriculture, Chemistry and Physics (AgCP) from a recognized University or Board.
- ii) A candidate must have secured a minimum of 50% marks (40% for SC/ST/DAC candidates) in aggregate in the qualifying examination.

The printed copy of the Acknowledgement Sheet along with supporting documents should reach the Registrar, Assam Agricultural University, Jorhat 785013 on before June 30, 2014. Documents received after the prescribed last date will not be considered.

Applications, submitted online within the prescribed date, shall be screened by a Screening Committee and a MERIT LIST of the eligible candidates will be prepared based on aggregate percentage of marks secured in the subjects - Biology, Chemistry and Physics or Agriculture, Chemistry and Physics (as the case may be) of the qualifying examination. In case of equity, merit shall be calculated by taking the marks of Biology or Agriculture first and then marks of Chemistry and lastly marks of Physics. Even after that, if the equity remains, then aggregate percentage of marks of HSSLC examination shall be taken into consideration.

5.2.1.3. B.V.Sc. & A.H. Degree Programme

Admission into the B. V. Sc. & A. H. programmes of the University will be governed by the Veterinary Council of India – Minimum Standard of Education - Degree Course (B. V. Sc. & A. H.) Regulations, 2008. However, the qualified candidates must fulfill the eligibility criteria of the University.

a) Extracts of the VCI Regulations, 2008

Regulations Part III (6)

A candidate shall not be admitted in to B.V.Sc. & A.H. degree course unless:

He/she has passed the qualifying examination as defined under these Regulations with the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English as Core course and obtained marks as specified under Regulations Part III (7) or an examination equivalent to Intermediate Science examination of an Indian University/Board recognized by the Association of Indian Universities taking Physics, Chemistry and Biology including practical test in each of these subjects and English.

Regulations Part III (7)

(1) The selection of students for admission to B.V.Sc. & A.H. Degree Course shall only be on the basis of merit through a competitive entrance examination to achieve a uniform evaluation, as there may be variation among students at qualifying examinations conducted by different agencies.

NOTE: To be eligible for competitive entrance examination, candidate must have passed any of the qualifying examination as enumerated under the head, "Admission to B.V.Sc. & A.H. Degree Course" at Part III (6) above.

(2) A candidate under General Category for admission to the B.V.Sc. & A.H. degree course must have passed in each of the subjects of English, Physics, Chemistry and Biology and obtained 50% marks in aggregate of these subjects, at the qualifying examination. Admission of students to B.V.Sc. & A. H. degree course shall be made only on the basis of his/her merit in the competitive entrance examination. No other merit/weightage shall be considered for admission to B.V.Sc. & A. H. degree course.

(3) In respect of candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes/ the Scheduled Tribes or other special category of students as specified by the Government from time to time, marks required for admission shall be 10% less than that prescribed for general category. Where the seats reserved for the Scheduled Caste and the Scheduled Tribes students in any State cannot be filled for want of requisite number of candidates fulfilling the minimum requirement prescribed from that State, then such vacancies shall be filled up on All India basis with students belonging to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes getting not less than the minimum prescribed pass percentage.

(4) The students, educated abroad seeking admission into Veterinary Colleges in India, must have passed the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English up to the 12th Standard level with 50% marks in the individual subjects.

(5) Sponsored candidates shall have to qualify the admission procedures as laid down for the students under General Category.

(6) Admission of candidates to B.V.Sc. & A. H. degree course under bilateral exchange programme shall be regulated by Veterinary Council of India.

(7) 15 % of the total number of seats of each Veterinary College shall be reserved to be filled on an All India basis through Common Entrance Examination (All India 'Pre-Veterinary Test') to be conducted by the Veterinary Council of India.

(8) The candidates selected through this examination shall be admitted in various Veterinary Colleges as per the eligibility criteria prescribed in these regulations only and the last date for reporting of these candidates to the allotted University/Veterinary Institution shall be the 31st August of that year irrespective of the closing date of admission of that University/Veterinary Institution for that year, if earlier. (The last date of

reporting in the College by the eligible candidates in case of AAU is August 31, 2014).

(9) A candidate shall not be allowed admission to B.V.Sc. & A. H. degree course including those admitted under 15% reserved quota of Veterinary Council of India if he/she suffers disabilities in physical fitness as listed below:

- a) disability of total body including disability of chest/spine more than 50%.
- b) disability of lower limb of more than 50%
- c) disability of upper limb
- d) visually handicapped candidates and those with hearing disability.
- e) candidates with progressive diseases like myopathies etc.
- f) disabilities which otherwise would interfere in the performance of the duties of a veterinarian.

(10) The disability should be certified by a duly constituted and authorized Medical Board comprising of at least three specialists out of which two should be of the specialty concerned and the candidate has to present him/her- self before the Medical Board. The last valid disability certificate of the candidate from a Medical Board should not be more than three months old from the date of submitting his/her

certificate for disabled candidates.

b) Veterinary Entrance Test (VET) conducted by AAU

(1) The candidate shall have to appear in a Veterinary Entrance Test (VET) on the date & time notified.

(2) Please refer to the eligibility criteria mentioned in clause no. 5.2.1 & 5.2.1.3 above.

(3) Students applying for Veterinary Entrance Test 2014 (VET 2014) should follow the following steps:

Step 1:

a) Only online Application form will be accepted for VET 2014. Registration is open from **April 21, 2014** and registration will be closed on **May 30, 2014**.

b) During the registration process the student must have (i) a scanned passport size photograph (3cm x 4cm) and (ii) a scanned signature (3cm x 1cm) of the candidate both in jpeg format.

Registration process cannot be completed without these scanned files.

c) After successful registration a Registration ID will be issued to the applicant. **The Registration ID should be used in all the correspondences in future.** Registration will be completed only after successful uploading of

the scanned photograph and signature.

d) Students will login again with the Registration ID, Username and Password to view their personalized page.

e) Students will download/ print the online *challan* and pay ₹ 1100.00 at any branch of State Bank of India. Please ensure with the Bank employee that the **remittance is made on the Applicant's name.**

f) Students will again login and enter the Journal number of the paid *challan*.

g) After verification the students will be allowed to print their Admit Card to appear in the VET 2014.

h) The **Admit Card can be downloaded/printed** by the applicant at any time till the date of VET 2014.

i) **Students need not send any document including the 'AAU Copy' of the paid challan during this step.**

j) The sponsored candidates from foreign country under Bilateral/Multilateral Agreement and NRI shall however be exempted from appearing in the VET 2014 provided that they meet the minimum eligibility requirements in force.

Step 2:

a) The candidate shall have to bring the printed **Admit Card** to appear in a Veterinary Entrance Test (VET 2014) on **Sunday, June 8, 2014 at 10.00 am.**

b) **Production of Admit Card to the invigilator of VET is mandatory,** failing which candidate shall be debarred from appearing in VET 2014.

c) The VET 2014 will be held in **Guwahati** (College of Veterinary Science, Khanapara and Karmashree Hiteswar Saikia College, Sixmile, Khanapara) and at **Jorhat** (Assam Agricultural University, Jorhat campus) only.

d) **The Examination Centre once opted cannot be changed.**

e) The questions for the Entrance Examination will be of objective type based on 10+2 level.

f) The Entrance Examination shall be of 2 hours duration and shall comprise of three parts, viz. Biology 40 marks, Chemistry 30 marks and Physics 30 marks. There shall be separate papers for Zoology & Botany. The question papers shall consist of 100 multiple choice of one mark each with no negative marking.

g) Merit List consisting of Roll numbers of the

qualifying candidates shall be published in the university's website on **June 20, 2014.**

h) Mere qualifying in the Entrance Examination shall not automatically make an applicant eligible for admission. The merit-listed candidates shall have to appear for counselling and final selection as per schedule.

i) The applicant shall appear in the Entrance Examination in his/her own cost.

Step 3:

a) Application Form for appearing in the counselling will be available in the web from **June 2, 2014.**

b) Applicants can fill/update their information logging in with their already available Registration ID, Username and Password. Repeated updating of information is possible till the applicant **Finalize** their information (Please Note that the **Application cannot be accessed once FINALIZED**).

c) The applicant must update the data after declaration of 10+2 results. Applicants shall have to update their application online within **June 30, 2014** incorporating academic and other details.

d) After Finalization of the Application Form, the **applicants can print the Acknowledgement Sheet.**

e) The printed Acknowledgement Sheet with the required testimonials as given in the **Information Brochure** and the AAU Copy of the paid *challan* should be sent to The Registrar, Assam Agricultural University, Jorhat – 13 to reach by **June 30, 2014.**

f) ***The sponsored candidates from foreign country under Bilateral/Multilateral Agreement and NRI shall however be exempted from appearing in the VET provided that they meet the minimum eligibility requirements in force.***

5.2.1.4. B.Sc. (H.Sc.) Degree Programme

i) A candidate must have passed 10+2 examination with Biology, Chemistry & Physics (BCP) or Mathematics, Chemistry & Physics (MCP) or Home Science, Chemistry & Physics (HScCP) or Agriculture, Chemistry & Physics (AgCP) of a recognized University or Board.

ii) A candidate must have secured minimum of 45 % marks (35 % for SC/ST/DAC candidates) in aggregate in the qualifying examination.

5.2.1.5 Eligibility for VLEW, VFA & F.D.

In case of candidates working as VLEW/VFA/FD (Fisheries Demonstrator) in the State of Assam, the minimum qualification for admission shall be as under:

a) A candidate must have passed at least Higher Secondary/PU /PD or equivalent examinations in science group with Physics, Chemistry & Biology (or Botany and Zoology in place of Biology), with 45% marks in aggregate and must have passed in all subjects in one sitting.

b) Maximum age should not exceed 35 years on 01-08-2014.

c) Should possess at least 3 years practical field experience and,

d) Must be sponsored by the Director of Agriculture, Director of Animal Husbandry & Veterinary and Director of Fisheries, Govt. of Assam, respectively, for B. Sc. (Agri), B. V. Sc. & A. H and B. F. Sc. degree programmes.

5.2.2 Eligibility for Master's Degree Programmes

5.2.2.1. M.Sc. (Agri), M.V.Sc., M.Sc. (H.Sc.) & M.F.Sc. Degree Programmes

A candidate must have passed the B.Sc. (Agri)/B.Sc. (Hort.)/B.Sc (Agri. Biotech)/ B.Sc. (H. Sc.)/B.F.Sc. of 4 years duration;/B.V.Sc & A.H. (as the case may be) degree

Candidates must have passed the qualifying examination in one sitting or in betterment examination in minimum four subjects as per Board's criteria. ***Candidates passing in supplementary or compartmental or improvement examination in a single subject specified under 5.2.1.2, 5.2.1.3, 5.2.1.4 and 5.2.1.5 above are not eligible.***

To become eligible for admission in to various degree programmes of the University, a candidate must have passed in all the subjects, separately for theory and practical in the qualifying examination.

examination of this University or any other University recognized by this University securing a minimum CGPA of 2.60 in 4.00 scale or 6.00 in 10.00 scale or 50.00% and above marks in traditional system. This shall be relaxable for candidates having 5 years of service experience and deputed by the Govt. of Assam/AAU to a CGPA of 2.30 in 4.00 scale or 5.70 in 10.00 scale or 45 % of marks in traditional system.

5.2.2.2. M.Sc. (Agri.) in Food Science & Technology Degree

A candidate must have passed B.Sc., B.Sc. (Agri)/B.Sc. (Hort)/B.V.Sc. & A.H./B.Sc. (Home Science)/B.Sc. (Food Science)/B.E. or other equivalent degree (as the case may be) of this university or any other university recognized by the Assam Agricultural University securing a minimum CGPA 2.60 in 4.00 scale or 6.00 in 10.00 scale or 50% and above marks in traditional system. Thirty per cent (30%) of the total intake shall be made open to non-agri students completing 10+2+3 academic pattern.

The graduate from non-agri stream shall have to complete one year deficiency courses as decided by the Advisory Committee before entering the main degree programme.

Selection of the candidates for admission into M.Sc. (Agri) in Food Science & Technology is based on entrance test to be conducted by the Department.

5.2.2.3. M. Sc. (Agri.) in Sericulture Degree Programme

A candidate must have passed B.Sc. with Zoology, Chemistry and Botany, preferably with honours in Zoology with at least 45% marks in aggregate and should have at least 3 years of service experience and must be sponsored by the Govt. of Assam or the Central Silk Board. Candidates with B.Sc. (Agri) with a CGPA of 2.60 in 4.00 scale or 6.00 in

10.00 scale are also eligible to apply.

5.2.2.4. MBA (Agri. Business) Degree Programme

A candidate must have passed the B.Sc. (Agri), B.V.Sc. & A.H., B.E. (Agril. Engineering), B.Sc. (Dairy Science), B.Sc. (Home Science) of four year duration, B.F.Sc. or B.Sc. (Forestry) (As the case may be) degree examination of this University or any other University recognized by this University securing a minimum CGPA of 2.60 in 4.00 scale or 6.00 in 10.00 scale or 50.00% and above marks in traditional system. This is relaxable to candidates having 5 years of service experience and deputed by the Govt. of Assam to a CGPA 2.30 in 4.00 scale or 5.70 in 10.00 scale or 45.00% marks in traditional system.

5.2.2.5. M. Sc. (Agri) degree programme in Biotechnology

Selection of the candidates for admission to

M.Sc.(Agri) degree programme in Biotechnology is based on academic records and performance in the entrance test. Fifty per cent (50%) weightage is given for the academic record and 50% on the entrance test. Entrance tests consist of two papers - Paper I - General aptitude (50 marks), Paper II - Subject matter (150 marks) and viva- voce examination - (50 marks). The candidate must secure 50% marks in the written test to be qualified for the viva-voce examination.

Fifty per cent (50%) of the total intake will be considered for admission in this programme through combined Biotechnology Entrance Test conducted by the Jawaharlal Nehru University with preference to basic degree in Agriculture. The candidates from general stream shall have to undergo a bridge course.

A maximum number of 10 (ten) students will be eligible to avail merit scholarship at the rate of ₹ 4,500/- per

month based on merit and subject to fulfillment of eligibility criteria as notified.

5.2.2.6. M.V.Sc. degree programme in Animal Bio-technology

For admission to the M.V.Sc. degree programme in Animal Biotechnology, a candidate has to pass B. B.V.Sc & A.H. from a recognized university securing a minimum CGPA of 2.60 in 4.00 scale or 6.00 in 10.00 scale or 50% and above marks in traditional system. Out of 10 seats available per year, 5 seats are open for candidates who qualify in the combined Biotechnology Entrance Examination conducted by Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. For rest of the seats, a separate entrance examination is conducted by AAU as per the following marks distribution and pattern on a notified date in due course.

1. Animal genetics & breeding	= 20 marks
2. Animal reproduction, Gynaecology and Obstetrics	= 15 marks
3. Veterinary bio-chemistry	= 25 marks
4. Veterinary microbiology	= 25 marks
5. Veterinary physiology	= 15 marks

Types of questions: Objectives (Multiple choices)

Syllabus: UG syllabus of the concerned subjects as per recommendations of the Veterinary Council of India.

5.2.3 Eligibility for Ph.D. Degree Programme

5.2.3.1. Faculty of Agriculture and Home Science

A candidate must have passed M.Sc. (Agri)/M.Sc. (H.Sc.) (As the case may be) degree examinations in the

concerned discipline of this University or any other University recognized by this University with basic degree in Agriculture/Home Science with a minimum CGPA of 3.00 in 4.00 scale or 7.00 in 10.00 scale or 58.00% of marks in the traditional system relaxable for deputed candidates having 5 years of service experience to an CGPA of 2.85 in 4.00 scale or 6.70 in 10.00 scale or 55.00% of marks in the traditional system.

5.2.3.2 Faculty of Veterinary Science

A candidate must have passed M. V. Sc. examination of this University or any other University recognized by this University with basic degree in Veterinary Science with a minimum CGPA of 3.00 in 4.00 scale or 7.00 in 10.00 scale or 58.00% of marks in traditional system.

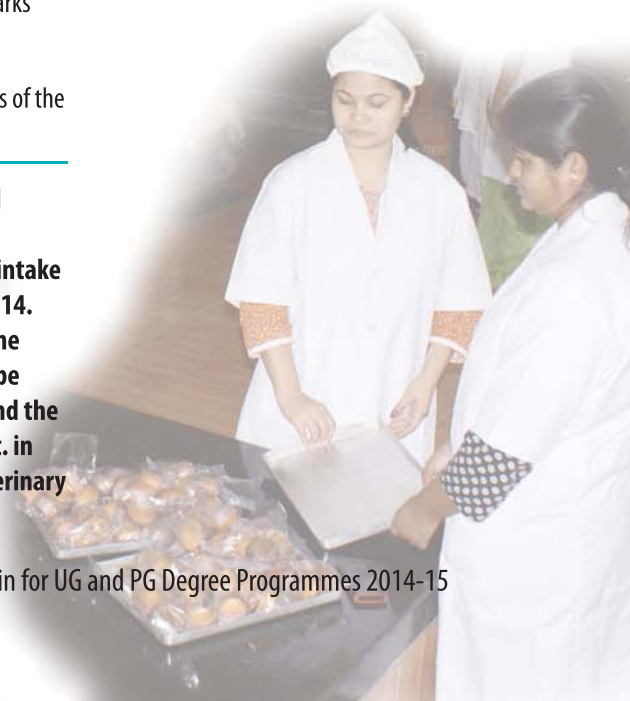
Ph.D. programme in Animal Biotechnology has been introduced with an annual intake of two students w.e.f. 2013-14. The admission shall be on the basis of the written test to be conducted by the College and the students completing M.V.Sc. in Animal Biotechnology /Veterinary

Microbiology /Veterinary Biochemistry /Veterinary Physiology /Animal Genetics & Breeding/Animal Reproduction, Gynecology & Obstetrics /Animal Nutrition/ Veterinary Pathology/ Veterinary Parasitology with a minimum CGPA of 7.00 in 10.00 point scale will be eligible for the course.

NOTES:

Considering the HR needs in the field of Biotechnology, 30% of the total intake of the Ph.D. programme in the Department of Agricultural Biotechnology under the Faculty of Agriculture shall be made open to the Non-Agri students completing 10+2+3 pattern majoring in Biochemistry /Bioinformatics /Biotechnology /Botany /Microbiology with 55% marks. Such students shall have to undergo a bridge course, either simultaneously or separately.

The candidates serving as JRFs/SRFs/RAs at AAU are eligible to apply for admission into the PG Programmes subject to fulfillment of other eligibility criteria.



5.3 Selection and Admission Procedure

The Application has to be submitted online within prescribed date which shall be screened in the similar way as in case of undergraduate programmes.

Eligible candidates will have to appear personally before the Selection Committee at their own expenses, as per scheduled date mentioned in second cover page of the Information Bulletin. Selection and admission of candidates is strictly on merit basis as per regulation in force.

Note: In-Service candidates must submit their Release Order/ No Objection Certificate from the competent authority to prosecute higher studies in AAU. Admission of in-service candidates from AAU shall be governed by the revised guidelines in force as notified from time to time.

5.5 Admission of Foreign including NRI and NRI-sponsored Candidates

5.5.1 Foreign candidate

Foreign candidate seeking admission shall forward their application through their respective Embassy/Mission at New Delhi or through the respective Indian Missions abroad to the Govt. of India/ICAR and their candidature shall be considered only if they are sponsored/cleared by the Government of India/Indian Council of Agricultural Research. Necessary fees shall be charged at the rates prescribed by the ICAR for the foreign candidates. Eligibility for admission of foreign students is as per qualifications prescribed by the University. A good knowledge of English is essential. A certificate of the candidates' proficiency in English issued by the respective Indian Mission abroad or recognized agencies should accompany their applications for admission. Foreign students should arrive one week before the start of the academic session to acquaint themselves with the activities of the College and to attend the orientation programme. They should contact the Dean/DPGS of the respective Colleges upon arrival for obtaining guidance in different matters.

5.5.2 NRI and NRI-sponsored candidate

All other conditions remaining unchanged, NRI candidates seeking admission shall apply through the respective Indian Mission abroad to the Govt. of India/ICAR and their candidature shall be considered only if they are sponsored/cleared by the Government/ICAR. The NRI-sponsored candidates must submit suitable credentials to the satisfaction of the competent authorities of the University. Eligibility for admission of NRI and NRI-sponsored candidates is as per qualifications prescribed by the University. A good knowledge of English is essential. NRI and NRI-sponsored candidates should arrive one week before the start of the academic session to acquaint themselves with the activities of the College

and to attend the Orientation programme. They should contact the Dean/DPGS of the respective Colleges upon arrival for obtaining guidance in different matters. The NRI and NRI-sponsored candidates, if selected, shall pay the fee of ₹ 5.00 lakhs in three installments -first one for ₹2.5 lakhs at the time of admission into the 1st year class and the remaining two for ₹1.25 lakhs each at the time of admission into 2nd and 3rd year class of the undergraduate degree programme in addition to fee prescribed for Special Category as indicated in Clause No 29. For post-graduate degree programme, the selected candidate shall pay the fee in two equal installments. Admitted students shall take admission in subsequent semesters by paying fee for HFC category.

6. Specialized Courses Offered

6.1 Specialized Course in Tea Husbandry & Technology

The University has the unique distinction of offering specialized course in **Tea Husbandry & Technology** in B.Sc. (Agri), M.Sc.(Agri.) and Ph.D. degree programmes so as to provide professionally trained and technically qualified personnel to man the various positions in the tea industry and its related organizations, The courses being multi-disciplinary and industry oriented, cover three broad areas of study, viz (i) Tea Husbandry (ii)Tea Processing and Engineering and (iii)Tea Economics and Management (including Tea Trade and Legal Matters). Provision of reservation of seat may be seen at Clause 7.1 (k) below.

6.2 Specialized Course in MBA (Agri-Business)

The University has prepared itself well to respond to the HR need in the field of Agri-Business Management and accordingly has started MBA (Agri-Business) degree programme under the Faculty of Agriculture. The programme is formulated with the objective to impart education and training for managing income generating and developmental activities of various sub-systems of agriculture, conduct research on varied problems in order to improve management capabilities. The syllabus for the programme is designed to train the students in the emerging areas of management science in

order to make them competent agri-managers to serve the agri-business sector. Students will get opportunities for taking case studies and research problems in their lines of specialization. Fees structure for the programme will be as per Clause No. 29.

7. Reservation of Seats

7.1. Undergraduate Degree Programme

The University makes provision for reservation of seats for eligible candidates belonging to the following categories. **Certificates mentioned against each of the categories must be enclosed** along with the **Acknowledgement Sheet.**

- (a) Scheduled Caste specified in relation to the State of Assam under Article 341 of the Constitution of India. *(Certificate from the competent authority)*
- (b) Scheduled Tribes (Plains and Hills) specified in relation to the State of Assam under Article 342 of the Constitution of India. *(Certificate from the competent authority)*
- (c) Other Backward Classes/ More Other Backward Classes specified in relation to the State of Assam which include one seat for Tea Garden Labourer (TGL) in the Faculty of Agriculture only *(Certificate from the competent authority).*
- (d) Candidates who are children of the regular AAU employees, retired /deceased University employees *(Certificate from the Registrar, AAU)*
- (e) Candidates who are victim or children, brother, sister of martyrs

- of Assam Agitation. *(Certificate from the Govt. of Assam)*
- (f) Candidates representing the State of Assam in games and sports *(Certificate from the Director, Directorate of Sports, Govt. of Assam)*
- (g) Candidates who are children of defense personnel, paramilitary force personnel, ex-serviceman and serving armed forces personnel *(Certificate from commanding officer/competent authority).* The defense personnel should be working in Assam for last 1 year or more
- (h) Candidates from outside the State of Assam through AIEEA Test conducted by ICAR or VCI.
- (i) Candidates from foreign countries including NRI and NRI-sponsored candidates
- (j) Candidates belonging to the States (other than Assam) covered under the North Eastern Council (NEC). *The candidates are to be nominated/sponsored by the respective State Government with a pro-rata contribution @ ₹2.00 lakh per student.*
- (k) Candidates belonging to States/ Union Territories other

- than Assam for specializing in Tea Husbandry & Technology in the B.Sc. (Agri) degree programme. Such candidates are to be sponsored by the tea growing States/Union Territories of India. *The sponsorship certificate from the Director/ Secretary, Agriculture or Education of the concerned State Government/Union Territories is to be attached with the Acknowledgement Sheet.*
- (l) Son/daughter/grand-son/grand-daughter of freedom fighter *(Certificate from the Principal Secretary to the Chief Minister certifying the freedom fighter and from Deputy Commissioner certifying direct relationship of the applicant with the freedom fighter).*
- (m) Candidates working as VLEW, VFA & F.D. (sponsored by the Govt. of Assam)
- (n) Persons with Disabilities as per provisions of Section 39 under '**The persons with disabilities (Equal opportunities, protection of right and full participation) Act, 1995'**
- (o) Wards of Kashmiri migrants *(Certificate from the competent authority)*

7.2. Post-Graduate Degree Programme

- (a) At least 50% of total seats in a discipline shall be reserved for domicile of Assam on merit basis. Remaining seats shall be filled up on merit from amongst all eligible candidates. In case of non availability of sufficient number of candidates in Assam quota, the seats will be filled up from amongst the other categories.
- (b) Reservation under different categories will be as per university norms & guidelines.
- (c) 25 % of total seats in a Faculty shall be reserved for the candidates sponsored by the ICAR.
- (d) 3 % of total seats in a Faculty shall be reserved for Differently Able Persons as per The Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995.

Note: Subject to availability of seats, any Indian national can seek admission directly into various P.G. Degree Programmes of the University on payment of higher fee provided the essential eligibility requirements are fulfilled.

8. Permanent Residence Certificate

All candidates, belonging to the State of Assam and the candidates under Higher Fee Category must submit the Permanent Residence Certificate issued by the competent authority (Deputy Commissioner/District Magistrate/SDO Civil) of the Government concerned. However, it is exempted for the candidates belonging to the following categories:

- (a) Sponsored by ICAR/VCI
- (b) Nominated/sponsored by NEC
- (c) Children of defence personnel, paramilitary force personnel, ex-service and serving armed force personnel
- (d) Wards of Kashmiri migrants
- (e) Belonging to the states/union territories other than Assam for specializing in Tea Husbandry & Technology
- (f) In-service candidates deputed by the Govt. of Assam
- (g) Foreign, NRI & NRI-sponsored candidates

9. Gap Period Certificate

If a candidate discontinued his/her studies after the qualifying examination, he/she shall have to furnish a gap period certificate only from local police authority (Annexure-I).

10. Physical Fitness

Admission for UG Degree Programme shall be subject to the medical fitness of the candidates, being declared as such by the University Medical Officer or Medical Board constituted by the University. The candidate shall have to submit a duly filled-in prescribed format (Annexure-II) and present herself/himself for medical examination on the date of interview/admission as specified.

11. Payment of Fees

Subject to declaration of physical fitness by the Medical Officer/ Medical Board, a candidate has to take admission on payment of prescribed fees (Refer Clause No. 29) immediately after selection. In case of failure to pay fees at the time of admission, the seat allotted to the candidate will stand forfeited and the seat(s) thus vacated will be allotted to the next candidate(s) in order of merit.

12. Second Counseling

Vacancy arising out of any reasons shall be filled up by selection of candidates on the 7th day from the normal date of registration in order of merit.

13. Re-admission

A student who leaves the College with permission from the Dean/Assoc. Dean/DPGS (as the case may be) after completion of the requirement of at least one semester may be readmitted after a break of not more than two subsequent semesters on payment of prescribed re-admission fee.

14. Advisory Service

Each undergraduate student shall be assigned to an adviser by the DSW/ADSW/DDSW at the time of student's admission. The adviser shall maintain personal records in respect of each student's academic progress, deficiencies in studies as well as co- curricular and extracurricular activities. The students shall apprise of problems and difficulties, if any, to the advisers for necessary advisement and guidance.

In case of Post-graduate student, a Major Adviser shall be assigned to each student by the Head of the Department as per provisions of the Regulation of Academic Matters.



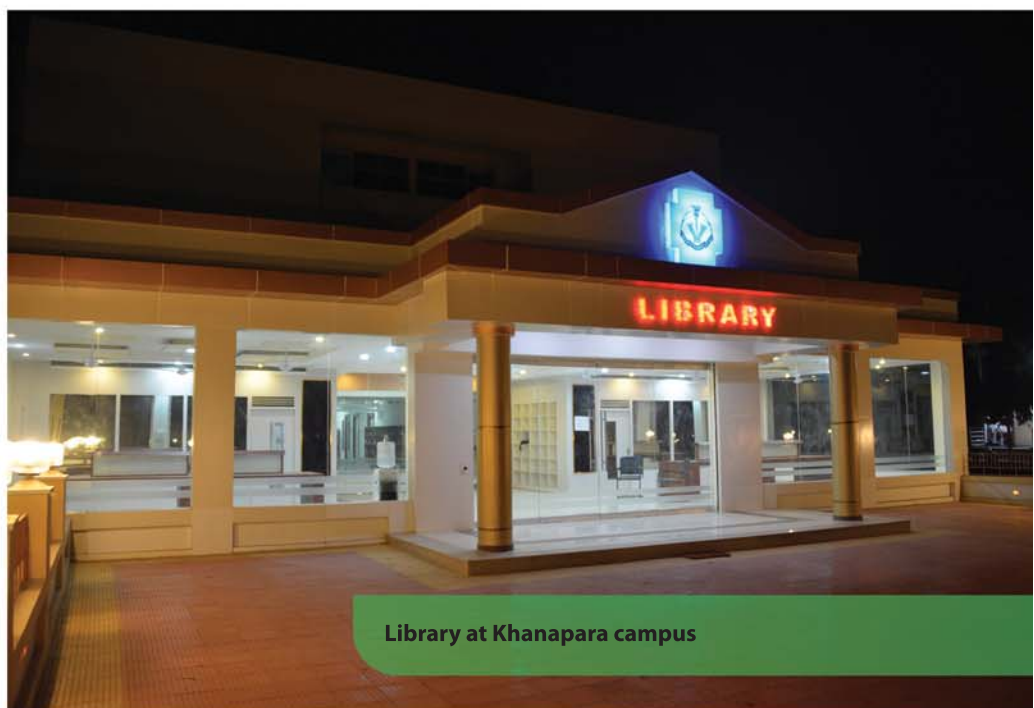

15. Library

The Rev. B.M. Pugh Library is the Central Library of AAU, located at Jorhat Campus. Each of the constituent colleges of the University has in its campus a separate Library. The Rev. B. M. Pugh Library has a total of 1,67,215 books, 75 numbers of current periodicals, 16,591 back volumes and 313 Ph.D. theses. In addition, the Library has CAB-CDs, CABI e-books of Agriculture and allied fields covering the period 1972-2012 and 2013 onward respectively. The Library has facilitated online access to 2,854 e-journals on Agriculture and related technologies under CeRA (Consortium for E-Resources in

Agriculture and Allied Sciences) and DeLCON (DBT-Electronic Library Consortium). The Library also provides facilities to full text electronic database of Agricultural Doctoral Dissertations through the ICAR's project *Krishiprabha*. The Library has a LAN setup with 30 terminals for online access.

16. Residence

Regular students are required to stay in hostels of the University unless permitted otherwise by the concerned authority. Students are admitted to the hostels upon payment of hostel dues (Refer Clause No. 29) at the time of admission into each semester. The hostels are provided with the basic amenities. A student may require a minimum of ₹1200.00 p.m. as mess dues.

17. Teaching

17.1 The System

The course credit system with Internal as well as External evaluation is followed in the University for both the Undergraduate and the Post-Graduate degree programmes. The medium of instruction in both the programmes is English.

17.2. Academic Year

The academic year of the University is from August to July. The academic year consists of two terms, each term of minimum 110 instructional days excluding the examination days. Each term is called **Semester**. There is a break of few days between two consecutive semesters.

17.3 Courses

During a semester, the students register themselves for a number of courses. A **Course** is a unit of instruction of a subject matter under any discipline carrying a specific number of Credit hour(s).

17.4. Credit Hours

Credit hours signify the quantum of work done corresponding to 1 hour of theory class or 2-3 hours of laboratory/field practical every week during a semester in respect of a particular course.

17.5. Attendance

A student is to maintain a minimum of 75% attendance separately for theory and practical in each course failing which he/she is debarred from appearing in the End term examination.

18. Examination

There are two examinations in a semester, viz., **Mid term examination** and **End term examination**. Mid term examination is conducted centrally in each College with two papers a day in the middle of the semester, whereas the End term and practical examinations are

held at the end of the semester as per Academic Calendar. Besides, a student has to appear in quizzes/tests and carryout field/ laboratory/library/ clinical assignments throughout the semester.

In case of B.V. Sc. & A.H. degree programme there is a system of **annual composite examination** at the end of each academic year culminating in the end of professional programme, beginning with first professional. The answer scripts of the annual examination shall be examined by the external examiner.

18.1 Experiential Learning Programme for Under-Graduate Programme

As per recommendations of the **Fourth Dean's Committee on Agricultural Education of India**, ICAR, New Delhi, an under-graduate student has to undergo an Experiential Learning Programme (ELP) of 20 credits in one semester in the Faculty of Agriculture, Horticulture, Sericulture and Home Science. This generates self-confidence and hands-on expertise in a particular area of Agriculture/Home Science in entrepreneurship development.

18.2. Rural Work Experience / Internship Programme for Under-Graduate Programme

The University is dedicated to the cause of the farmers, who mostly live in the villages, and the students after obtaining their degrees have to serve these people. For this the students are equipped with some experience on the rural agricultural scenario. As per guidelines of the Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR), New Delhi under the new course syllabus, **Rural Agricultural Work Experience Programme (RAWEP)** is offered to the students of Agriculture, Horticulture and Sericulture. The students admitted to B.Sc. (Agri.)

degree programme have to complete one semester of RAWEP with the host farmers in the villages. However, the students opting for specialization in Tea Husbandry and Technology shall undergo Tea Industrial Work Experience Programme (TIWEP) in lieu of RAWEP. The students admitted to B.Sc. (Hort) and B.Sc. (Seri) degree programmes have to complete one semester of **Rural Horticultural Work Experience Programme (RHWEP)** and **Rural Sericultural Work Experience Programme (RSWEP)**. Similarly, the students of Faculty of Home Science shall undergo **Rural Awareness Work Experience Programme (RAWEP)** and In-Plant-Training.

The students of the Faculty of Veterinary Science shall undergo Internship for one semester and the students of Fisheries Science shall undergo **Fisheries Work Experience Programme (FWEP)** for one semester.

19. Evaluation

The level of performance of each student in a particular course is evaluated in a 10.00 point scale/grade. The performance of a student in the examination is finally calculated on the basis of **Cumulative Grade Point Average** (CGPA), as detailed in Regulations on Academic Matters, 2008 for UG and 2010 (Amended) for PG programmes.

20. Climate

The climate of the state is pleasant for most part of the year. The winter lasts for about five months viz., from October to February. Though summer starts from March - April, the weather is quite pleasant. There is heavy rainfall during the months of July and August.

21. Dress and Clothing

During summer, cotton clothing is adequate but in winter, warm clothes, quilts or blankets are necessary. In addition to bed rolls, students should have the mosquito nets.

The students should dress in College blazer during games, sports and other special occasions. Students are to use white aprons during laboratory practical and shorts in field practical. For attending University functions and within the campus, every student is expected to be properly dressed.

22. Discipline

All students are to maintain perfect discipline and proper scholastic atmosphere during their stay at the University/College. On admission into any College and hostel, students must acquaint themselves with the University, College and hostel rules and regulations. Copies of Regulations on Academic Matters of Assam Agricultural University will be provided to each student during orientation in the respective Colleges. **Ignorance of any rules will not be treated as excuse.** The Dean/DSW/

Assoc. Dean/ADSW/DDSW shall be responsible for the maintenance of discipline and good behaviour of students in his/her college and anywhere on the campus or outside it. In case of any violation of disciplinary rules as mentioned in the Regulations on Students Discipline, the matter shall be referred to the Disciplinary Committee for action. Ragging is completely banned in the University. On the date of orientation each of the selected students and their parents shall require to submit affidavit in accordance with the UGC regulations on "**Curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions, 2009**". Copy of the said Regulation shall be provided to the selected candidates at the time of admission.



23. Scholarships, Medals and Awards

23.1. Scholarships and Other Supports

State Merit Scholarships are awarded by the University to the eligible students. Such scholarships are awarded on the basis of merit and subject to fulfillment of eligibility criteria as notified. In addition to the State Merit Scholarships, the eligible students are also provided with other financial support as enumerated below:

Besides, there is provision of support in the form of **monthly mess dues** for the economically backward students admitted in AAU. The students desiring to avail financial support shall have to apply to the Registrar through respective Deans/Assoc. Dean within a month from the date of admission in prescribed forms.

23.2. Award/Continuation of Scholarship

Subject to the provision of regulation, award/continuation of scholarship shall depend on the maintenance of overall satisfactory progress in studies, regular attendance and good conduct of the student and on such other terms and conditions as laid down in the Regulations on Academic Matters as amended from time to time.

23.3. Discontinuation of Scholarship

Award of scholarship of any kind shall be discontinued from the date, the awardee is placed on the academic or conduct probation, as per provisions of Regulations on Academic Matters as amended from time to time.



23.4. Non-eligibility for award of scholarship

Students on deputation receiving pay or deputation allowances and/or any other financial assistance from any source in the form of scholarship and foreign students shall not be

eligible for award of any type of scholarships offered by the University.

23.5. Other scholarships

Besides the University scholarships a good number of other scholarships, are offered by the State Govt., Central

Government, ICAR, DBT, ITA, TAI and other Agencies. However, a student shall be eligible to accept only one scholarship.

23.6 Medals and Cash Prizes

The University offers a number of Gold Medals/ Cash Prizes to meritorious

students at the University convocation, subject to the fulfillment of eligibility criteria as indicated against each of them in the Table above.

All Medals/Cash Prize holders must complete the degree programme within the minimum period prescribed for the degree without repeating any course (s) and without

obtaining "F" grade in any course (s). He/she also must not be placed under Academic Probation or Conduct Probation at any point of time during the study period.

24. Training & Placement

A Training and Placement Cell of Assam Agricultural University was set up in 1998. The Training & Placement Cell is an essential component of the University catering to the needs of its students for their career development. The Cell organizes training programmes on Personality Development, Communication Skills, Leadership and such other areas. It facilitates campus interviews and placement in various government and non-government organizations like Union Bank of India, United Bank of India, Punjab National Bank, CAPART, Gassim Pierre Ltd., Pradan, Bayer Crop Science Ltd., Indofil Chemicals Ltd., Harrison Malayalam Ltd., Goodrick India Ltd., Amalgamated Plantations Ltd., Yes Bank Ltd., Prithvi Industries Ltd., Tea Board etc. The Cell has adequate infrastructure facilities like fully air-conditioned group discussion room, interview room, office, waiting hall etc. for conducting interviews, computers with net connectivity for job search and resume posting by the students, and own website for job information and other related helps.

During 2013-14, the Cell organized Placement Week, where 12 corporate sectors

from different parts of the country took the interview of 87 students and have shortlisted 30 students for further processing to recruit them in their companies.

The Cell organized various trainings and coaching programmes in the following areas during 2013-14:

- *Communicative english and personality development
- *Preparation for different competitive examinations including JRF
- *Preparedness to compete in ARS/NET etc.
- *Innovation, employability, skill development and career building

25. Students' Welfare

25.1. Sports, Recreation, Social Service

The Directorate of Students' Welfare provides facilities for games and sports, study circle, music, drama etc. to enrich the cultural, literary, physical as well as social life of the students. The University has its own play ground, well equipped indoor stadium and gymnasium. The University teams are provided adequate support for participation in local, regional and national

sports events and games. During March, 2014, the University successfully organized the XV All India Inter Agricultural University Sports and Games Meet in which 47 Agricultural Universities from all over the country with 1763 students participated.

The Students' Society/ Union of each College arrange the co-curricular activities such as games, sports, athletics, drama, social service etc. NSS/NCC programmes are also organized in each College as a part of social/national service.



25.2. Medical facilities

There is provision for medical care and health service in each of the Colleges.

25.3. Student's Aid Fund

With a view to render financial aid to students in distress, a students' aid fund has been instituted in each College. All students are required to contribute in the fund at the beginning of each academic year to aid and assist economically backward students.

25.4. Student's Society/Union

All students admitted to the College automatically become members of the Student's Society/Union and are entitled to participate in the Society/Union election. All students are required to pay the Students Society fee at the beginning of each academic year.

25.5. Students' Magazine

The Students' Society/Union of each college publishes a magazine to encourage creativity of the students. The students are to pay the magazine fee at the beginning of each academic year.

25.6. Educational Tour

There is provision of educational tour for both UG and PG students.

25.7. NCC/NSS

Every Under-graduate student of 1st and 2nd year classes of Faculty of Veterinary Science has to undergo the N.C.C. training as prescribed in syllabus. However, in case of foreign students, attendance in N.C.C. is exempted. Students of Agriculture, Horticulture, Sericulture, Home Science and Fisheries shall have to participate in N.S.S. programmes in lieu of N.C.C.

26. Orientation

In order to make the students conversant with the requirements and working of the course credit system of instruction followed at this University, an orientation programme is arranged on the dates specified by the respective Colleges. **Attendance in Orientation programme is compulsory for all the newly admitted students.**

The candidates who fail to attend the orientation classes will forfeit their seats and the same will be filled up in the Second Counseling in order of merit. The candidates so admitted, shall have to attend the Orientation programme organized on the day of admission.

27. Refund of Caution Money

Refund of caution money shall be made to a student as per Academic Regulation of the University.

28. Convocation

The degree is finally awarded to the student by the Chancellor in the Convocation Ceremony.

29. Fees

The fees payable for different degree programmes under various heads are indicated at Annexure III. The fees and charges mentioned under this clause are subject to revision as and when necessary.
